

RESUME SUMMARY

CARL R. BOGARDUS, JR., M.D.

**Professor, Clinical Director and Vice Chairman
Department of Radiation Oncology - University of Oklahoma
President and CEO - BMSi**

Dr. Bogardus entered his academic medical career as Assistant Professor of Radiation Oncology at the University of Oklahoma in 1964. After a distinguished career, he retired as Professor-Emeritus April 1, 1995. He then began private practice of radiation oncology at the Cancer Treatment Centers of Oklahoma. Dr. Bogardus also had a career in business and consulting as the Medical Director of Cancer Care Network. With emphasis on documentation of procedures and Medicare compliance issues, he was very involved in site visits and audits of radiation oncology departments nationwide.

In September, 2004 Dr. Bogardus was asked to return to the University of Oklahoma to open a new radiation treatment facility. He is now Professor, Clinical Director and Vice Chairman of the Department of Radiation Oncology at the OU Stephenson Cancer Center. Since his return, the Radiation Oncology program at OU has grown to six full-time physicians treating over 1,000 new patients per year. The Radiation Oncology Residency program was reactivated and currently supports six Residents in training.

Dr. Bogardus' primary interest over the years has been the development of the Radiation Oncology Coding and Nomenclature System resulting in numerous publications and presentations relative to the socioeconomic aspects of radiation oncology. A great percentage of radiation oncology billing done today follows the guidelines laid out in his original "*User's Guide for Radiation Oncology Management and Billing Procedures*". As CEO of Bogardus Medical Systems, Inc, he has written "*Basic Principles of Billing, Coding and Compliance In Radiation Therapy*", the successor reference work. Dr. Bogardus is currently the featured speaker at BMSi Seminars which provide attendees with vital information related to radiation therapy billing and coding.

In 1986, Dr. Bogardus, recognizing the significant need for software to assist Radiation Oncology manage a complexity of billing for the performed procedures. As a result of his efforts, the first commercially available Radiation Oncology charge entry software was developed as "Medic for Radiation Oncology". In 2000 he took this experience and started the ONCOCHART[®] Electronic Medical Record software program, which is now the nation's premiere program for management, documentation, charge capture and compliance in Radiation Oncology.

Dr. Bogardus has served as president of the American College of Radiology, chairman of the board, and president of the American Society for Therapeutic Radiology and Oncology. He has served as secretary/treasurer of both the ACR and ASTRO, and as a member of the Board of Chancellors. He is still very much involved in the financial and reimbursement aspects of medicine.

Since 1996, Dr. Bogardus has shared his extensive knowledge of the complex rules and regulations regarding documentation, coding and billing for radiation oncology by conducting seminars. He conducts these seminars in various locations around the country to allow greater access to the information.

He is presently serving on the Council on Medical Services for the Oklahoma State Medical Association and is the Oklahoma Radiation Oncology Representative and Vice Chairman of the Novitas Medicare Carrier Advisory Committee. Dr. Bogardus has served as Radiation Oncology Institute Community Practice Co-chair since 2008 and on the Board of Trustees as Trustee-at-Large 2009-2014. He serves as Member of the American Society for Therapeutic Radiology and Oncology's Health Policy Advisory Board, Health Policy Council. Since 2011 he has served on the Radiation Oncology Institute Nominating Committee.
